GET YOUR JUNIOR PLAYER SOME FREE GOLF THIS SUMMER

Beginning June 10 and running through September 4, the Resort Club will offer a special member-guest rate of \$35 for those playing after 12:00 Noon.

This rate is also available to those using “Unaccompanied Guest Vouchers” and the “Social Member Vouchers.” Don’t forget, guests of members up to a total of 12 players including the member can receive this rate if the tee time is made on the day-of-play.

A Junior who is accompanied by a Barefoot Resort Adult Member may play for free if the tee time is booked after 12:00 Noon from June 10 through September 4 (maximum of one free playing Junior per paying Adult Member). A Junior is defined as age 17 and under. If a Barefoot Resort Adult Member has more than one Junior playing, the additional Junior golfer(s) will be required to pay the normal Junior rate or normal Junior Member rate of \$25. If play is booked prior to 12:00 Noon, all Juniors pay normal rate.

Message from the Director of Maintenance



We will be over seeding the tees, fairways and approaches on all our golf courses again this fall on the following dates: The Dye Club-September 9th, The Norman Course-September 11th, The Love Course-September 16th and The Fazio Course-September 18th. After each course is over seeded, we will be cart path only each morning until the dew dries for a short period

of time in order to prevent the rye seed from being dragged into the rough areas. We appreciate your understanding throughout this process as we prepare the golf courses for the winter months. This will insure lush, green fairways, tees and approach areas long after the summer Bermuda grass has gone dormant.

The Registration Form for the 2013 Member-Guest Tournament is now available on the Barefoot Resort & Golf website, www.barefootgolf.com. The event has been scheduled for August 29th through September 1st. Two-man teams will once again compete in five 9-hole matches. One match will be played in the morning with another in the afternoon, along with a playoff in the afternoon of the final day. There will be boxed lunches for the first two days of the tournament with a buffet style lunch on the final day. A practice round is available on the first day, August 29th, but it will not be included in the price of the tournament. A welcome party is currently being planned for August 29th and a place will be determined in the near future.
